






- Positive partnerships with PD, FD, NS health dept

- Preparation and training








- Single point of entry, with buzz in, and visitor management system

- Shatter Resistant Glass Film






- Security cameras

- Classroom doors/locks








- Traffic, bike, and pedestrian safety

- Landscaping (Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED)








• Double buzz-in system at school main entrances

• Security cameras (coverage and ability to monitor)

• Fire alarm systems






- Areas with limited cell phone coverage
- No exterior door alarms
- No backup generators at Elementary and Lydell
- Building layouts that present challenges for supervision (specifically at MS)
- Location of Special Education spaces
- Compartmentalization of building sections ability to close off for security



- Roof accessibility challenges at Elementary and HS
- Athletic and Activity equipment excess and/or lack of appropriate/safe storage









- Lydell PA system access
- Methods of 2-way communication between the office and other staff/spaces
- Large upper windows between classrooms and the hallways
- Visitor sign in process improvement
